Course Description & Objectives

This course prepares professional nurses to provide comprehensive evaluation, treatment and evidence collection for survivors of sexual violence as Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE). The objectives of this course address the development of skillful assessment techniques, thorough understanding of the dynamics of rape and intimate partner violence and the mechanics of injury which provide a solid foundation for working with survivors. Although the curriculum *prioritizes* the importance of the victim's treatment and recovery, it also recognizes the importance of evidence collection, objective documentation and the need to provide testimony based on professional experience. This course combines the knowledge and expertise of a nationally recognized faculty with a variety of educational methods to give participants the maximum opportunity for professional growth in this advanced practice role. In addition, for the first time in the NJ-NY-PA area the course will combine self-study with classroom participation: Participants will:

- *Demonstrate a Comprehensive Understanding of the Dynamics of Sexual Assault/IPV*
- *Identify Professional Roles in the Treatment of Sexual Assault / IPV Survivors*
- *Demonstrate Components of the Assessment, Examination and Evaluation of the Sexual Assault / IPV Survivor*
- *Identify Treatment Protocols and Therapeutic Interventions for Sexual Assault / IPV Survivors.*
- *Discuss the Legal Aspects of Sexual Assault and IPV and Providing Testimony*
- *Articulate Issues Related to Ongoing Professional Development*
